Erin's Law

Ohio law requires [public schools](#), [educational service centers](#), [community schools](#) and [STEM schools](#) to provide in-service training to educate school personnel on a variety of topics. In-service training must incorporate content on child sexual abuse. Law enforcement officers or prosecutors who have experience in handling cases involving child sexual abuse or child sexual violence must present the training.

Compliance Refresher

Reporting child abuse and neglect for Educators, [ORC 2151.421](#)

(new requirement effective 10/3/2023; a new version of this section will take effect 1/1/2025)

The schools (including community schools) must adopt or adapt the Department's curriculum **or** shall develop (in consultation with public or private agencies or persons involved in child abuse prevention or intervention programs) a program of in-service training in the prevention of child abuse, violence, and substance abuse and the promotion of positive youth development. Training must include information on the obligation to report child abuse and the consequences for failure to do so.

Personnel required to receive the training are identified in [ORC 3319.073](#) and include: school nurse, teacher, counselor, school psychologist, or administrator, counselor, school psychologist, or administrator.

How we verify compliance:

- Schools must include in their contract, as a responsibility of the governing authority, they will follow Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 2151.421.
- We will set up an Epicenter requirement to collect a copy of the training program and proof of training given to all applicable staff, school reporting procedures, and that the board approved the curriculum.
