Educational Records (Senate Bill 29)

We have received some additional guidance around questions regarding <u>SB 29</u> and educational records, electronic monitoring and notification requirements around school devices. The Ohio Department of Education and Workforce (ODEW) legal department and Office of Community Schools have communicated that this does not apply to community schools (at this time). They expect it to be updated in law to include community schools and will keep us posted.

Monthly Board Review of Student Enrollment

Effective October 24, 2024, the monthly governing authority review of student residency records for students enrolled in the school is no longer required in law. The requirement for the Monthly Enrollment Verification will be eliminated, beginning in November.

Compliance Refresher

Reading Acheivement Improvement Plan Requirements ORC 3302.13 and 3301.0715(G)

Definition

The Reading Achievement Plan is a district plan for raising student achievement in reading. Each school district or community school that meets the following criteria, as reported on the past two consecutive report cards issued for that district or community school, must submit a Reading Achievement Plan.

(1) The district or school received a performance rating of less than three stars for early literacy component on Ohio's School Report Card

(2) Fifty-one per cent or less of the district or school's students scored proficient on Ohio's State Test for grade 3 ELA.

Deadline

Schools with a current plan would submit a Reading Achievement Plan Progress Report and make updates, if necessary to their Reading Achievement Plans. Both templates are available <u>here</u>.

Reading Achievement Plans OR the revision must be submitted to ReadingPlans@education.ohio.gov by December 31st. Ohio law also requires the posting of all Reading Achievement Plans to the Department's website, <u>here</u>.

How we verify compliance:

- 1. Schools' contracts, as a responsibility of the governing authority, include compliance with the code section noted above.
- 2. Schools must submit their Reading Achievement plan or revision via Epicenter by December 31st.
